MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE RECONSTITUTED DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP, PAPER & ALLIED INDUSTRIES HELD ON JULY 27, 2012 IN THE COMMITTEE ROOM NO. 152 , UDYOG BHAWAN , NEW DELHI.

The first meeting of the Reconstituted Development Council for Pulp, Paper & Allied Industries (DCPPAI) was held under Chairmanship of Shri Harsh Pati Singhania, M.D. J. K. Papers Ltd. , on July 27, 2012 in the Committee Room No. 152, Udyog Bhawan, New Delhi.

List of Participants is Annexed as Annexure - I

Initiating the meeting, Shri Harsh Pati Singhania, welcomed the members of the reconstituted Development Council. In his opening remarks the Chairman expressed confidence and optimism that Indian Pulp & Paper Industry has a great potential for growth in all the major paper grades segments viz writing and printing , packaging , and specialty papers. He said that the confidence stems from the increased focus on improving literacy rate (Sarv siksha abhiyan) , growth of retail market chains and increased demand for hygienic/ food grade related paper and paper products. In this perspective, he stressed upon the important role, the Development Council has to play in addressing the challenges before the industry like high cost of raw material and energy (coal) , competitiveness of the industry, technological and environmental issues (PAT, RPO & Environmental Compliance) , human capital and skilled manpower through active coordination with the Ministry/ policy makers. He also acknowledged the contribution by various sub-committees constituted under Working Group on Pulp & Paper Sector for providing inputs and recommendations on key areas for consideration during 12th Five Year Plan and stressed on the need for regular follow up with Planning Commission for acceptance and effective implementation of the recommendations.

With due permission from the Chairman, Dr. R.M. Mathur, Member Secretary took up the agenda items for discussion :

ITEM NO.1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP, PAPER & ALLIED INDUSTRIES HELD ON DECEMBER 28, 2011.

The minutes of the DCPPI Meeting held on December 28, 2011 and circulated to the members was confirmed by the members of reconstituted Development Council.

ITEM NO.2 ACTION TAKEN ON THE DECISIONS OF LAST MEETING OF THE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL HELD ON DECEMBER 28, 2011.

1. Availability of Raw Material - Availability of degraded forest land for plantation Development Council

The Development Council was informed that the recommendations made in the working Group Report on availability of raw material were forwarded to Ministry of Environment & Forests by DIPP. The Chairman advised that the sub-committee on raw material may pursue the matter on priority with Secretary, Ministry of Environment & Forests for issuing necessary notification for facilitating the availability of land through Forest Development Corporations (FDC).

Chairman suggested that IPMA should approach & meet the concerned ministry & explore possibilities on the issue of Government intervention in facilitation Pulp & Paper Mills to get access to or acquire forest plantations abroad to meet the raw material requirement and seek help of DIPP as required.

2. Improving Recovery of Waste Paper

It was informed that the DIPP has uploaded **Discussion Paper on Collection & Recycling of Waste Paper in India** on its website and invited views and suggestions for development of a suitable policy for collection and recycling of waste paper from mills and mill associations. However, till date, only one feedback from IPMA has been received by the DIPP. The Chairman called on the mills / mill associations to provide their comments / feedback in order to facilitate DIPP to formulate the suitable policy on the issue. Shri R.C. Rastogi, President IRPMA was requested to facilitate in providing additional feedback and comments on the background paper from other mill associations, stake holders and help in suitable policy drafting.

3. Financial Assistance under Technology Modernization Assistance Program (TMAP)

It was informed that a committee has been constituted for defining interventions for technology modernization assistance to Industry. After receipt of report of the Committee, appropriate decision will be taken in consultation with Planning Commission, Department of Expenditure etc. It was stressed by the Chairman and the members that this issue needs to be given high priority.

4. Studies on Technological Status and Potential of Productivity Enhancement in Indian Pulp & Paper Industry under Existing Liberalization and Globalization Scenario

It was informed that for carrying out the above study, technical and commercial bids have been received from three parties :

- Spectrum Planning (India) Ltd, Faridabad
- Datamation Consultants Pvt.Ltd., New Delhi
- Poyry Management Consulting Ltd, Finland

The Chairman constituted a five member committee for evaluation of the technical bids comprising of :

- Shri Madhukar Mishra - IPMA
- Shri Anil Kumar / Shri P.G. Mukundan (alternate member)- IARPMA
- Shri PS Patwari / Shri S.K. Mishra (alternate member) – INMA
- Shri Mukul Ratra - DIPP
- Dr. R.M. Mathur – CPPRI

The Chairman desired that the evaluation of the bids be completed before the next Cess Committee meeting.

ITEM NO.3 STATEMENT OF STATUS OF THE R&D PROJECTS FUNDED BY CESS GRANT AUTHORITY UNDER DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP PAPER AND ALLIED INDUSTRIES

The Chairman desired that a presentation on impact assessment of the recommendations findings of last 5-6 completed Cess Projects may be made in the next Cess Committee meeting in order to help the Cess Committee to evaluate the relevance of the projects executed as well in granting approval to the new projects.

It was also informed by Dr. Mathur that till date around 49 Cess project reports is now available on DCPPIAI website. The Chairamn also advised CPPRI to ensure the timely completion of the projects for the benefit of the industry.

ITEM NO.4 RECONSTITUTION OF CESS COMMITTEE

The list of members presented of the for the reconstitution of Cess Committee was approved by the Council. The name of Shri R.Vijay Kumar, Secretary General, INMA as representation from INMA and

Shri Neehar Aggarwal , Sr.Vice President (Operations), Bilt as representation from IPMA were also included in the Cess Committee. The revised list of members for reconstituted Cess Committee is enclosed as Annexure –I

ITEM NO.5**ANY OTHER ITEM WITH THE PERMISSION OF CHAIR**

1. **Inclusion in the Company Bill 2011 Schedule, the critical machinery, equipments and accessories used in Paper Industry for purpose of "Depreciation".**

It was suggested that a delegation from IPMA may take up the matter with Ministry of Corporate Affairs for issuing fresh notification in context of pulp & paper industry.

2. **PAT scheme issues related to Baseline Data.**

As the omissions / correction required in the PAT guidelines issued by BEE, Ministry of Power are related to only few mills, it was advised by the Chairman that the individual mill may take up the matter itself with Ministry of Power. In case , the issue is not resolved IPMA could provide necessary assistance to sort out the issue.

3. **Ban on import of second hand plant and machinery /equipment for Paper Industry**

Members of the Council expressed strong reservations on this issue as such a notification will be detrimental to growth of paper industry Since there was no confirmation on the notification in this regard , the Chairman informed that IPMA has already taken up the case with concerned ministry and advised them to take the matter further by

organizing a meeting with selected industry delegation. Chairman requested DCPPIAI to take up the matter & help in this regard.

4.

Availability of Authentic Data on Paper Production

It was informed by the Chairman that as a fallout of the recent directions of **Competition Commission of India (CCI)** to **Cement Manufacturers Association (CCA)**, availability of production data of other industrial sectors including pulp and paper may also not be made available by the mills or corporate groups to the industry associations / DIPP. It was suggested that in absence of availability of authentic data from official sources on the actual paper production in the country, the Development Council may approach Tax Research Unit, Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance, Government of India to provide quarterly data of excise collection from paper industry in order to assess the actual paper and paper board production in the country.

It was informed that one of the options is to set up a statistical cell for paper industry at CPPRI.

5.

Inclusion of Waste Paper under Hazardous Waste Category

The issue was raised by the members that due to inclusion of Waste Paper in Hazardous Waste category the mills have to face a lot of problems specially in inter- state transportation of the waste paper. The Chairman requested DIPP and sub- committee on Waste Paper to take up the matter with Ministry of Environment & Forests to get the waste paper excluded from Hazardous Waste category.

6.

Revision of Specifications for Paper & Board to meet International Standards

Shri Ranjan Kuthari from AIFMP expressed need for revision of existing BIS specifications and framing the new specifications for paper and paper boards for helping the printing industry to get indigenous paper and paper board of international quality in order to become globally competitive. He also requested to develop the BIS specifications for hygienic and food grade paper products.

The Chairman appreciated the printing industry view and requested Dr. R.M. Mathur who is also Chairman Sectional Committee CHD 15 of Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS), New Delhi for Development of Standards of Different Grade of Paper & its Products to take up this issue with BIS for developing / revising specifications for packaging, hygienic and food grade paper products. He also emphasized on need to bridge the technology gap in order to produce paper and board quality meeting international packaging requirement in order to save the valuable foreign exchange and make printing industry competitive.

The meeting ended with a "Vote of Thanks" to the Chair .

The meeting of the Development Council for Pulp, Paper & Allied Industries (DCPPAI) was held under Chairmanship of Shri Harsh Pati Singhania, MD, J K Paper Limited, on April 5, 2013 in the Scope Building, Bhabha Hall, CGO Complex, New Delhi.

List of Participants is Annexed as Annexure - I

Initiating the meeting, Shri Harsh Pati Singhania, welcomed the members of the Development Council. In his opening remarks the Chairman expressed his concern on the issue of raw material availability and its high cost which is not only affecting the overall cost economics of paper production but also holding the growth of Indian Paper Industry. Chairman informed that in the past few months significant squeeze in margins has been observed by most of the mills due to rising cost of fibrous raw materials, particularly wood. This along with rising cost of basic inputs, increase in freight due to increased fuel prices have further added to the woes of the Paper Industry. He drew the attention that in recent times number of mills have invested heavily in capacity expansion / technological upgradation to reduce production cost, improve product quality and achieve environmental sustainability but the raw material availability issue is offsetting the targeted objectives. He also drew attention on the proposed National Policy on Indian Paper Industry being framed up by DIPP and stressed upon the members to extend necessary support and inputs.

With due permission from the Chairman, Dr. R.M. Mathur, Member Secretary took up the agenda items for discussion:

ITEM NO.1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING OF THE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP, PAPER & ALLIED INDUSTRIES HELD ON July 27, 2012.

The minutes of the DCPPI Meeting held on July 27, 2012 and circulated to the members was confirmed by the members of the Development Council.

ITEM NO.2 ACTION TAKEN ON THE DECISIONS OF LAST MEETING OF THE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL HELD ON July 27 2012.

i) Availability of Raw Material - Availability of degraded forest land for plantation

The Council expressed concern over the response received by DIPP from Ministry of Environment & Forests (MoEF) where the Ministry was silent on the issue of availability of degraded forest land to paper industry for plantation. It was also pointed out that the working group on raw material availability constituted by Development Council also had strongly advocated in favour of making available the degraded forest lands to meet the raw material shortage. Ms Sunita Yadav, Deputy Secretary, DIPP informed that the copy of letter received from MoEF is being forwarded to the mill associations for their comments.

The Chairman stressed on need to continue the interaction with the respective ministries and advised IPMA to:

- a) Take up the issue on priority and arrange a meeting of a delegation from Paper Industry with Secretary DIPP.
- b) A request for letter from office of Secretary DIPP to Secretary MoEF indicating the specific recommendations of Working Group Report on this issue .
- c) To also facilitate a meeting with Secretary MoEF & DG Forests.

- d) To prepare a brief presentation on impact of raw material shortage and increasing raw material prices on cost competitiveness of Indian Paper Industry to highlight the issue effectively during the meetings.

ii) Improving Recovery of Waste Paper

Shri R.C. Rastogi , President IRPMA informed that feedback and comments from other associations and stake holders related to Background Paper on Collection & Recycling of Waste Paper in India will be submitted to DCPPI by April 30, 2013. The Chairman advised that a committee constituting of Shri Pramod Agarwal , Shri R.C. Rastogi and Shri P. S. Patwari may look into the feedback and propose further course of action that needs to be adopted to formalize a suitable policy to DIPP within six weeks.

Sh. P. S. Patwari, President, INMA informed that indigenous wastepaper component used in Indian mills stands at 35% against a figure of 27-28% a year ago, spurred by high price of waste paper.

iii) Studies on Technological Status and Potential of Productivity Enhancement in Indian Pulp & Paper Industry under Existing Liberalization and Globalization

In view of limited bidding for the global tender on the above survey study as well as availability of only one qualified bidder, the Development Council advised that along with re- advertising the global tender, major global players may also be sensitized about the publication of global tender and invite bids from them. Shri R.R. Vederah was requested to assist in this endeavor

iv) Technology Modernization Assistance Program (TMAP)

Council was informed that the final report prepared by the sub-committee constituted by DCPPI in its meeting held on 21 April, 2011 has been submitted to DIPP for consideration. The suggestions made in this report include exemption from the duty of excise and additional duty of excise leviable on

paper and paper products, similar to notification No. 39/2001 of Central Excise to facilitate the mills for making fresh investments in technology up-gradation. The Chairman requested that DIPP may take up the issue on priority.

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v) PAT scheme issues related to Baseline Data

The progress on the issue was briefed by CPPRI. It was informed that after notification of specific energy consumption (SEC) and targets for reduction in energy consumption by Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) in March 2012, representations from various mills and associations were received to normalize the SEC based on change in energy consumption due to variation in product grades, environmental compliance etc. Accordingly a sub - committee constituted by BEE is working on modification of Form -1 to address the concerns and reservations of the industry. After finalization, the Form 1 will be circulated among all the 31 Designated Consumers (DC's). Data collected from the DC's would be used to normalize the specific energy consumption for individual mills.

The Chairman advised the subcommittee to finalize the Form-1 and take necessary action for normalization of specific energy consumption of the pulp and paper sector DC's at the earliest.

vi) Ban on import of second hand plant and machinery /equipment for Paper Industry

It was informed that a notification on this issue has already appeared in national newspapers dated February 28, 2013 and the members expressed satisfaction on the issue. It was decided not to pursue the issue further.

vii) Availability of Authentic Data on Paper Production

It was informed that based on the recommendations of the Cess Committee, CPPRI will submit in the next Cess meeting a revised plan on the project including detailed breakup of recurring expenditure every year as well as methodology for collection of data on continuous basis.

viii) Newly Proposed Provision on "Depreciation" Under Companies Bill, 2011

IPMA informed that a meeting was held with Director MoCA on April 4, 2013 on the issue wherein it was informed that the Company Bill 2011 is still pending with Rajya Sabha. Once the bill is passed by Rajya Sabha and made into an Act, the necessary steps for issue of amendment in context of Pulp & Paper industry can be taken accordingly. IPMA also requested for a letter from Secretary DIPP, to Secretary MoCA on this issue. The Chairman, advised IPMA to continue to pursue the matter further.

ITEM NO.3 STATEMENT OF STATUS OF THE R&D PROJECTS FUNDED BY CESS GRANT AUTHORITY UNDER DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP PAPER AND ALLIED INDUSTRIES

The members were satisfied with the statement of status of the R&D projects funded by Cess grant authority as presented in the meeting.

ITEM NO.4 APPROVAL OF THE BUDGET FOR SMOOTH FUNCTIONING OF THE CESS SECRETARIAT

The Development Council unanimously accorded approval to Budget of Rs 11.00 Lacs (Rupees Eleven Lacs Only) for the year 2013-2014 for smooth functioning of the Cess Secretariat. The details of approved budget are as under:

ITEM NO.5

(A) CONFIRMATION OF REAPPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR FOR AUDIT OF DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR 2011-12 & 2012-13

The Development Council confirmed the reappointment of Auditor – M/s Sanjay Mishra & Co. for audit of Development Council for the year 2011 –12 & 2012-13 on the existing terms and conditions i.e. Rs. 10,000/- per annum + Service Tax and TA/DA as applicable.

(B) APPROVAL FOR APPOINTMENT OF NEW AUDITOR FOR AUDIT OF DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR 2013- 14

The Development Council accorded approval for appointment of new auditor for audit of Development Council for the year 2013 -14.

ITEM NO .6 DEVELOPMENT OF INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES AT PORTS TO IMPORT WOOD LOGS / CHIPS

In view of Increased Imports of wood logs / wood chips due to shortage of indigenous raw material , the Chairman laid emphasis on availability of adequate infrastructure facilities at Indian ports to handle the same. In this context, he desired that IPMA should prepare a document on the issue highlighting existing status of infrastructure facilities available at ports to handle the imported wood logs and chips, major problems , required facilities to be created and the policy intervention to be sought along with specific recommendations related to paper industry and submit it to Development Council for further action.

The Chairman also suggested that the same points may also be included in the TOR of Study on Technological Status and Potential of Productivity Enhancement in Indian Pulp & Paper Industry under Existing Liberalization and Globalization.

ITEM NO .7 PROMOTE 'AGRO FORESTRY'

The members were unanimous that the term "agro forestry" should be substituted by term "contractual farming" or "tree farming" in further deliberations/ discussions and representations.

Chairman suggested to set up a "Wood Mission", where in agricultural universities & state agricultural departments should promote wood growing. Members were requested to advice on this thought. IPMA emphasized on need to initiate efforts for shift in Government policy by expanding the scope of definition of agro commodity and equating tree plantation with other plantations like cashew nut , tea, coffee , rubber , coconut etc. This will help in attracting Government incentives, formulation of suitable policies on same lines as that for other plantation and will allow tree plantation on agricultural lands leading to improvement in raw material availability. Chairman asked IPMA to develop a thought paper on this issue for further deliberation in the next meeting.

ITEM NO .8 SKILL DEVELOPMENT

The Development Council was informed about the M.Sc Cellulose and Paper Technology course being conducted jointly by FRI & CPPRI, the first batch of which will pass out in June 2013. Director, CPPRI requested for industry support for providing suitable placement to the existing batch of students for the success of the course. Further it was informed that discussions with various ITIs to integrate / include pulp & paper course in their curriculum is under progress and a few ITIs have been approached in this regard. It was also suggested to monitor the status of "Working Group Recommendations" on this issue.

ITEM NO .9 ANY OTHER ITEM WITH THE PERMISSION OF CHAIR

i) Dumping of Imported Newsprint

INMA drew attention towards the crises being faced by Indian Newsprint Industry due to dumping of imported newsprint. Sharing their concern, the Chairman advised INMA to submit a representation on need and ways for strengthening of anti dumping mechanism in context of Imported newsprint to DIPP for necessary action and requested DIPP for sympathetic consideration on the issue.

The meeting ended with a "Vote of Thanks" to the Chair.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP, PAPER AND ALLIED INDUSTRIES HELD ON OCTOBER 4, 2013.

The meeting of the Development Council for Pulp, Paper and Allied Industries (DCPPAI) was held under Chairmanship of Shri Harsh Pati Singhania, MD, JK Paper Limited, on October 4, 2013 in the Committee Room No. 152 , Udyog Bhawan, New Delhi.

List of Participants is Annexed as Annexure - I

Initiating the meeting, Shri Harsh Pati Singhania, welcomed the members of the Development Council and dwelt upon the various pressing issues confronting the Indian Paper Industry which were also included as agenda items of the meeting such as - rising wood prices, availability of degraded forest land for plantation, skill development etc. With permission from Chairman, Dr. R.M. Mathur, Member Secretary, took up the agenda items for discussion.

ITEM NO.1 Confirmation of the Minutes of the last meeting of the Development Council for Pulp, Paper and Allied Industries Held On April 5, 2013.

The minutes of the DCPPAI meeting held on April 5, 2013 and circulated to the members was confirmed by the members of the Development Council.

ITEM NO.2 Action taken on the decisions of the last meeting of the Development Council held on April 5, 2013.

i) Availability of Raw Material - Availability of degraded forest land for plantation .

The Chairman expressed concern that in the last 10-15 months there has been 40-50 % rise in wood prices due to which the industry has been forced to resort to import of wood/wood chips perhaps for the first time in its over 150 years history. If such a scenario persists, the Indian Paper Industry is expected to import around 20-25 Lac tones of wood over the next 12 months and the total imports for fibrous raw material including wood, pulp , waste paper & finished paper/board etc is likely to be over 3.0 billion US dollars.

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Thus, in present circumstances the need for degraded forest land for plantation has become more relevant than ever not only to ensure sustained raw material availability but to save valuable foreign exchange in national interest .

The Council expressed disappointment on the communication received from Ministry of Environment and Forests (MoEF) in response to the letter sent by the Hon'ble Secretary, IPP on the issue. As per the communication received , MoEF has indicated that it has no role in facilitating the availability of degraded forest land to paper industry for plantation. Instead, MOEF has advised the Paper Industry to contact respective State Forest Development Corporations (FDC's) on this issue

Shri Talleen Kumar, Joint Secretary, IPP advised that more home work needs to be done related to seeking information and clarity on the issue with respect to role, power and jurisdiction of State FDCs as well as MoEF in making degraded forest land available for plantation as well as status of various guidelines , rules and regulations on this issue. Once this is done , MoEF can be approached afresh by IPP / industry along with specific recommendations and directives about MoEF role in this matter.

Dr. R.M. Mathur informed the Council that the issue will be discussed with officials of MOEF to obtain relevant & factual position and role of MOEF in this regard.

ii) **Improving Recovery of Waste Paper**

Shri Talleen Kumar, Joint Secretary was of the view that subsequent to preparation of **Discussion Paper on Collection and Recycling of Waste Paper in India** by DIPP and incorporation of the feedback received from mill associations, there is now a need to move further in context of implementation of the policies, guidelines and recommendations. To avoid further delay he proposed for preparation of a self-sustaining and perpetuating pilot scale demo model on waste paper collection for implementation in a selected locality in the initial phase which could be further upgraded or replicated. Shri R.C. Rastogi, President, IRPMA agreed to prepare a project proposal for submission to DIPP to be taken up as Cess Project.

iii) Studies on Technological Status and Potential of Productivity Enhancement in Indian Pulp & Paper Industry under Existing Liberalization and Globalization Scenario

IPP Finance wing was requested to finalize the draft tender document at the earliest to enable CPPRI to initiate tendering process.

iv) Technology Modernization Assistance Program (TMAP)

The Council requested DIPP to review the proposal / recommendations already submitted at the earliest possible.

v) PAT scheme issues related to Baseline Data

Shri Sandeep Bhalla, JK Paper Ltd., and member of the sub-committee constituted by Bureau of Energy Efficiency (BEE) informed the Development Council that in the meeting held on October 4, 2013 (F.N.), the methodology for normalization of specific energy consumption (SEC) for Designated Consumers in Pulp and Paper Sector has been finalized and the format of revised Form 1 will be finalized by October 22, 2013. It was also informed that BEE proposes to hold a workshop after finalization of Form 1 to guide the Designated Consumers for submission of information data in the revised Form 1.

vi) Availability of Authentic Data on Paper Production

The Council was informed that the Cess Committee has accorded approval to establish Statistical Data Cell at CPPRI for collection of data on continuous basis in its meeting held on August 23, 2013.

vii) Newly Proposed Provision on "Depreciation" Under Companies Bill, 2011.

Under the new Companies Bill it appears that pulp and paper industry has been deprived of 'special rates' which otherwise have been prescribed for continuous process plants. This will cause a major dent in the book profits of the companies. The matter has been taken up with Ministry of Corporate Affairs. It was informed by IPMA that the matter is already being pursued by it.

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viii) Development of Infrastructure facilities at Ports to Import Wood Logs / Chips.

In context of recent increase in import of wood / wood chips and imported pulp and waste paper the Council was of the view that the raw material sub-committee of IPMA should take a note of concerned issues / policies which impede the movement of raw material from port to the mill site and discuss the matter both at Government level as well as with private ports.

ix) Promotion to Agro Forestry

IPMA to apprise the Development Council on the Thought Paper on Wood Mission in the next meeting.

x) Dumping of Imported Newsprint

To retrieve exact data and information related to the quantum of import of newsprint, INMA advised that DG Statistics and Commerce, Kolkata may be approached. DIPP informed that it has already taken note on the issue and the matter has been referred to Commerce Ministry.

ITEM NO.3 MAJOR ISSUES TAKEN UP FOR DISCUSSION DURING MEETING OF MEMBERS OF DCPPI AND OTHER REPRESENTATIVES OF PULP AND PAPER SECTOR WITH HONOURABLE MINISTER OF STATE, MINISTRY OF COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY ON 4.9.2013

The Chairman expressed satisfaction on the recent meeting of representatives of Paper Industry with Hon'ble Minister of State. He was happy to note that the Hon'ble Minister gave a patient hearing to the various issues confronting the Indian Paper Industry. DIPP informed the Development Council that the record note of the minutes of the meeting has been forwarded to the office of Hon'ble Minister of State, Ministry of Commerce and Industry for perusal and necessary action. The Chairman informed that the issues will also be taken up in the forthcoming pre-budget meeting .

ITEM NO.4 STATEMENT OF STATUS OF THE R&D PROJECTS FUNDED BY CESS GRANT AUTHORITY UNDER DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP PAPER AND ALLIED INDUSTRIES

The statement of status of the R&D projects funded by Cess grant authority was noted by the Development Council.

ITEM NO .5 ANY OTHER ITEM WITH THE PERMISSION OF CHAIR

i) Renewable Power Obligation (RPO)

The Chairman informed that black liquor has been defined as biomass and renewable source of energy by Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE). This has helped the pulp and paper mills which are incinerating black liquor and using steam generated for captive power generation in earning Renewable Energy Certificate (REC). However due to lack of clear policy and support at state level the mills are not able to encash the RECs generated . Shri Talleen Kumar, Joint Secretary advised IPMA to submit a detailed note on this issue to DIPP to pursue the matter with MNRE.

ii) Skill Development

Shri Talleen Kumar expressed need to prepare a sound blue print of the scheme which could address the manpower requirement of the Indian Paper Industry for next 15-20 years. He also advocated to develop selected ITIs for focused skill development / training centre and customized course aimed at providing separate training at apprentice level as well as for upgradation of knowledge and skill of existing workers. He advocated on the need for adoption of ITIs by various mills along with the commitment for absorption of the apprentices for success of such skill development courses. He also advised that National Skill Development Council may be approached for developing such a scheme or course. It was decided that the subcommittee on Human Resource Development constituted under Working Group on Pulp and Paper Sector will be contacting various ITIs to initiate such courses for providing trained manpower to paper industry.

iii) **Image makeover of Indian Paper Industry**

The Chairman said that the general public perception is that paper industry is a major consumer of forest wood and accordingly increased use of paper is likely to have significant environmental impact including global warming. This in fact is not true. He quoted a FAO report 2010, which states that around 93% of wood cut is used as fire wood in India, which itself contradicts general impression of paper industry being one of the major consumers of forest wood. Further in Indian context, the wood used by Indian Paper Industry for paper making is mainly sourced through farm or social forestry and not from forests. In this perspective, he said, there is a need for initiating a sustained campaign through print / TV media to promote increased use of paper.

The Council unanimously agreed to this proposal. However details about possibility for funding for development of such a campaign and its wide publicity through Cess funds will be taken up for discussion in next DCPPIA meeting.

iv) **Financial Assistance in Organization of Paperex 2013 Technical Conference October 24-27, 2013**

IARPMA requested the Development Council to provide financial assistance of Rs 10.00 Lacs (Rupees Ten Lacs Only) from Cess funds in organization of Paperex 2013 Technical Conference to be held at New Delhi from October 24-27, 2013. IARPMA confirmed that the funds will only be used in organization of technical conference in meeting out the travelling, boarding and lodging arrangements of the Guest speakers from abroad. DCPPIA accorded approval to the request.

v) **Enhancement of funds allocation to Development Council for R&D activities/ Cess Projects**

It was brought into the notice of the Development Council, that approx Rs 57.00 Crores (Rupees Fifty Seven Crores) are collected per annum as Cess from the Paper Industry goes to a consolidated fund of Ministry of Finance. From this corpus only a marginal amount i.e. around Rs 6.5 Crores is actually being made available to DCPPIA for base level support to CPPRI & R&D programmes for the Paper Industry. As a result there is paucity of funds to support the approved Cess projects. DIPP informed that release of Cess Funds is a prerogative of Finance Ministry and DIPP is not empowered to utilize / spend Cess funds

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directly. The chairman expressed need for more funds and requested DIPP to enhance the budget allocation to DCPPAI for supporting R&D activities.

The meeting ended with a "Vote of Thanks" to the Chair.

The Chairman also briefed the house about the trying times the Indian Paper Industry is facing due to continuous increase in cost of major inputs viz raw material and energy, availability of imported paper at a low cost due to free trade agreement between India and neighboring countries etc. He expressed dismay that under Make in India Mission launched recently by Government of India , the Indian Paper Industry has not been included and expressed need for efforts to be made by the Industry so that the benefits of Make in India mission is also extended to Paper Sector .

With permission from Chairman, Dr. R.K. Jain, Scientist F, CPPRI, on behalf of Member Secretary, DCPAPI took up the agenda items for discussion.

ITEM NO.1 Confirmation of the Minutes of the last meeting of the Development Council for Pulp, Paper and Allied Industries Held on October 4, 2013.

The minutes of the DCPPIAI meeting held on October 4, 2013 and circulated to the members was confirmed.



metro city , a huge investment to the tune of Rs 50-100 Crores (which include land , equipment for automatic sorting, training of manpower etc) will be required for which assistance from Government is needed. Alternatively, he also proposed exploring possibility of Integrating / such a demo project under Swacch Bharat Abhiyaan being executed by Government of India for funding such a project .

Shri Shallendra Singh, Joint Secretary, advised Shri Rastogi that in the initial phase a position paper for setting up a demo waste paper sorting centre on a small / pilot scale in a selected locality be prepared and submit the same to the DIPP for consideration .

The Council also appreciated the outcome of studies carried out by CPPRI on evaluation of paper making potential of used tetra pak carton fiber.

iii) **Studies on Technological Status and Potential of Productivity Enhancement in Indian Pulp & Paper Industry under Existing Liberalization and Globalization Scenario**

The council members advised that the comments of the technical committee on the technical bid and the commercial bid be placed before the Cess committee after its reconstitution for final decision.

iv) **PAT scheme issues related to Baseline Data**

The follow - up was noted by the Council.

v) **Technology Modernization Assistance Program (TMAP)**

The Council was intimated about the DIPP view that implementation of TMAP for modernization of Indian Pulp & Paper Industry is not feasible at present scenario. However, it was suggested that the matter may be reviewed / relooked in the context of the recommendations of the proposed study on - **Technological Status and Potential of Productivity Enhancement in Indian Pulp & Paper Industry under Existing Liberalization and Globalization Scenario.**

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL FOR PULP, PAPER AND ALLIED INDUSTRIES HELD ON June 1, 2016.

The meeting of the Development Council for Pulp, Paper and Allied Industries (DCPPAI) was held under Chairmanship of Shri Pradeep Dhobale on June 1, 2016 in the Committee Room No. 47, Udyog Bhawan, New Delhi.

List of Participants is Annexed as Annexure - I

Initiating the meeting, Shri Pradeep Dhobale, welcomed the members of the Development Council and expressed optimism for growth and progress of Indian Paper Industry in context of the improvement in present and projected GDP growth rate of the Indian economy. However, he said that though the macro economic indicators have shown a positive trend, the same growth has not been visible in paper sector as of now, and a growth rate of more than 6% may be a difficult task to achieve in the next five years.

Future trend in paper demand in context of increasing emphasis on Digital India vis a vis growth in on-line selling / e-commerce was also deliberated upon.

With permission from Chairman, Dr. R.K. Jain, Director Incharge CPPRI & Member Secretary took up the agenda items for discussion.

ITEM NO.1 Confirmation of the Minutes of the last meeting of the Development Council for Pulp, Paper and Allied Industries Held On October 4, 2013.

The minutes of the DCPPAI meeting held on March 13, 2015 and circulated to the members was confirmed by the members of the Development Council.

ITEM NO.2 Action taken on the decisions of the last meeting of the Development Council held on March 13, 2015.

i) Availability of Raw Material - Availability of degraded forest land for plantation.

DIPP informed that the policy paper on the above subject has been finalized by Ministry of Environment Forests & Climate Change (MoEF&CC) and a Cabinet Note has already been submitted to the stake holder ministries

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for comments. DIPP has already reverted back with comments on the Draft Cabinet Note and the process of promulgation of the policy is under way.

The Council put on record its appreciation for the efforts of DIPP in taking up this matter with MoEF&CC.

ii) Studies on Technological Status and Potential of Productivity Enhancement in Indian Pulp & Paper Industry under Existing Liberalization and Globalization Scenario

The council members were unanimous to defer the study till the year end by when the UNIDO - ICISID Project Report on **Development and Adoption of Appropriate Technologies for Enhancing Productivity in Paper & Pulp Sector** is expected to be available to industry to avoid duplication of the efforts. The Council was of the view that subsequent to submission of UNIDO report if required, a separate study to substantiate the UNIDO study may be undertaken which may involve much less financial requirement and time.

Further the Council also desired that representatives from Industry and DIPP should also be invited in the forthcoming meeting to be convened on June 21, 2016.

iii) Skill development

Shri A.S. Mehta and Dr.R.K.Jain informed the council about efforts being carried out for promoting skill development by their respective organizations. While Shri Mehta informed that the majority students of the ITI adopted by JK are being absorbed by their units, Dr Jain informed that it is in paper industry cluster of Kashipur & Muzaffarnagar have been contacted are discussion are underway for initiation of Paper Technology Course in these ITIs. At CPPRI level also there has been around 100 % growth in number of personnel being trained in various areas of paper technology including environmental management and chemical recovery.

CPPRI is advised to persue the matter with Muzaffarnagar and Kashipur Cluster on adoption of ITI's for skill development.

The statement of status of the R&D projects funded by Cess grant authority was noted by the Development Council. The Council desired that in future a detailed statement with date of project start and completion be presented to monitor the progress.
